Opening Week and Placement in Classes for the Coming Year

This week our students will be learning about "Being the Best You can Be" as they get back into school routines. Students will be in their classes from last year until our new organization and classes are set up. We hope to assign students to classes by Tuesday, September 13.

Taylor Park classroom teachers, learning support teachers, education assistants, support staff and the principal and vice-principal put a great deal of thought into organizing classes that will provide nurturing, productive learning environments. A number of criteria are considered such as: academic needs, maturity, attitude, behaviour, friendships, adult support time needed, and leadership qualities. We also try to balance the number of boys and girls and make sure each child can have students they can be friends with in their new class. We are unable to place students solely on the basis of their friendships from the previous year because of the need to balance classes. With these guidelines in mind, children are grouped into classes. We strive for balanced classes at every grade level. Traffic Concerns

Many people expect to find parking for drop off and pick up at a school, but that is not possible at Taylor Park. Our school is within walking distance for almost all our students so I recommend that families walk – and even enjoy walking, even in the rain☺. When students walk to school, the exercise and fresh air gets their brain ready and they are calmer and ready to learn when they enter the school. When there are parents parking illegally in the turn-around area, emergency vehicles such as fire trucks and ambulances cannot get to our school. There is only a very limited drop off/pick up area that stretches along the school side of Mission Ave. Remember that the driver of the car must remain behind the steering wheel while stopped in a loading area. Our school welcomes the enforcement of traffic and parking rules for the safety of our students by the RCMP. Violators of traffic and parking rules will be ticketed.

Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)

All parents of students attending Taylor Park are automatically members of the Taylor Park PAC (Parent Advisory Committee). We hold meetings each month to discuss issues of concern for our students' learning and how to support programs at the school through fundraising. The Principal, Vice-Principal and Head Teacher bring issues for us to discuss and we have an opportunity to bring up school wide concerns with them as well. Our meetings are informal and have lots of laughter combined with the satisfaction of contributing to the learning of our students. Monthly meetings alternate between Tuesday evenings at 7pm and Friday mornings at 9:15am. All meetings are held at Taylor Park in the library for evening meetings and in the staff room for morning meetings.

Student Absence

For your child's safety and security, parents are asked to call the school and leave a message to let us know if a student will be absent or late (604-296-9034).



Late to School

It is important that your child arrives to school on time. Students miss important instruction at the beginning of the day and interrupt the learning of others if they arrive late. The teacher will mark your child late after 8:55. If your child does arrive later than 9:20 am, he/she needs to report to the office to 'sign in' and receive a late slip for class. This informs the secretary that your child is safe at school.

Leaving School Early

A student leaving school early, either with a parent or with parent permission needs to report to the office to 'sign out'. If a student is ill, the secretary will phone home to ask you to pick up your child or to get permission to send your child home alone.

Parents Visiting the School

If you need to see your child for any reason or wish to leave a message for your child or the teacher during school hours, please report to the office. Please do not go directly to your child's classroom. If you are helping or volunteering in a classroom, you need to sign in at the office and receive a visitor's badge.

Morning Entrance

We are unable to provide supervision before school so students should not arrive at school before 8:45. They should line up outside their classroom door when the bell rings at 8:50. This builds community by providing a time and space for a connection between families and the teacher. It also gives students a sense of ownership for their place. When students arrive early they can talk with their friends before school so their level of comfort is higher and their brains are ready to learn. It also allows the teachers to meet and greet children and their caregivers at one door and helps us monitor who is in the building. When students rush in at the last moment or come late, their brains and emotions are not settled and they will not learn as well as they could if they were a few minutes early.

Cell Phones

We realize that many parents provide their children with cell phones. Our position is that these cell phones should only be used to contact you before and after school hours. With that in mind, we ask for your support in reinforcing the following guidelines:

- Cell phones (or any expensive items such as iPads) are here at your child's own risk in terms of loss or breakage.
- All cell phones are to be turned off during class time unless the teacher has made arrangements with the class/student to use the device for a lesson/project.
- If you need to contact your child during the school day, please call the office.
